

Supervisor Greg Cox joined the County Board of Supervisors in 1995 and oversees a regional government with a \$5.40 billion budget and more than 17,000 employees.

The Supervisor's District includes the U.S.-Mexico border, including the busiest land border crossing in the world at San Ysidro Port of Entry.

He has been a leader in advocating for more federal spending to create efficient, safe border crossings in San Ysidro and Otay Mesa to spur cross-border commerce. Supervisor Cox has supported investments in infrastructure, including new roads, highways and a cross border terminal. He has worked with property owners and the business community to enhance development in unincorporated East Otay Mesa, the largest, available area of vacant land able to accommodate advanced manufacturing and attract thriving businesses and create good-paying jobs.

In addition to his role on the County Board of Supervisors, Supervisor Cox serves on the Board of the San Diego County Regional Airport Authority and the California Coastal Commission.
